

Chronology and Duration of Key Inquiries and Interventions

- **The Disciplined Services Commission (2003–2004):** Established in 2003 to scrutinize the Guyana Police Force and security services during the height of East Coast Demerara violence. It submitted its comprehensive report to the National Assembly in **May 2004**—roughly a **1-year duration**.
- **The UK Security Sector Reform (2006–2009):** Conceived in 2006 with a 3-year implementation target, the British-backed program was ultimately scrapped by the UK government in **October 2009** after roughly **3 years** of friction and delayed execution. [
- **U.S. Federal Investigation of Roger Khan (2006–2009):** Following his capture in Suriname in June 2006, U.S. federal authorities investigated and prosecuted his cocaine and weapons network, culminating in a guilty plea and sentencing in October 2009—spanning just over **3 years**.
